Remuneration Rates for Sessional Visiting Medical Officers

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Information Bulletin is to provide information on the revised remuneration rates for sessional visiting medical officers (VMOs) for services rendered on or after 1 July 2023.

KEY INFORMATION

NSW Health organisations are required to remunerate VMOs in accordance with these rates unless approval to provide non-standard rates and conditions has been provided by the NSW Ministry of Health.

NSW Health organisation must ensure

That services provided under the VMOs service contracts are provided personally by the contracted VMO and are not sub-contracted out of performance by another practitioner

Split contracts in respect of services to be provided at the one facility are only offered in circumstances outlined in NSW Health Policy Directive *Visiting Practitioner Appointments in the NSW Public Health System* (PD2016_052)

Note that this Information Bulletin does **not** apply to VMOs who are:

- remunerated under the arrangements set by the rural doctors' settlement package
- appointed as a pathologist
- appointed as a radiologist where there has not been agreement for standard sessional remuneration to apply.

Chief Executives are accountable for ensuring that the remuneration authorised in the Information Bulletin, or otherwise specifically approved by the NSW Ministry of Health, is paid to VMOs.

Sessional Visiting Medical Officer Remuneration

- 1. Sessional Visiting Medical Officer Remuneration Rates
- 1.1 The ordinary hourly rates and on call rates which Public Health Organisations are authorised to pay to sessional Visiting Medical Officers have increased by 4% for services rendered on or after 1 July 2023. Background practice costs have also increased by 4%.
- 1.2 Where a sessional Visiting Medical Officer is called back to duty, public health organisations are authorised to pay additional remuneration as follows:
 - (a) For services provided during a call-back within the hours of 8.00 am to 6.00 pm Monday to Friday inclusive (other than on a public holiday) at the Visiting Medical Officer's ordinary hourly rate of remuneration plus a loading of 10%.
 - (b) For services provided during a call-back outside the hours of 8.00 am to 6.00 pm Monday to Friday inclusive at the Visiting Medical Officer's ordinary hourly rate of remuneration plus a loading of 25%.
 - (c) For services provided during a call-back on a public holiday at the Visiting Medical Officer's ordinary hourly rate of remuneration plus a loading of 50%.
- 1.3 A sessional Visiting Medical Officer shall be paid the following hourly rate of remuneration for each ordinary hour (and on a proportionate basis to the nearest quarter hour) specified in a sessional contract:

i.	with less than 5 years' experience	\$168.20
ii.	with at least 5 years' experience and/or who has been admitted to Fellowship of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners and/or Fellowship of the Australian College of Rural and Remote Medicine	\$216.15
b)	Specialist	\$244.70
c)	Senior Specialist	\$262.60

b) Surgeon	\$52.05

and on a proportionate basis to the nearest quarter hour.

ON-CALL

A sessional Visiting Medical Officer shall be paid an amount as shown below for each hour

(or part thereof) the officer is rostered to be on-call. This amount remains payable to a Visiting Medical Officer during periods spent travelling or rendering services pursuant to a call-back.

Rate per hour \$15.50

2. Regional Visiting Medical Officers

- 2.1 **Regional Visiting Medical Officer** means a Visiting Medical Officer who is appointed:
 - (a) for a continuous period of at least 12 months under a service contract in respect of one or more of the regional hospitals listed below; and
 - (b) under a service contract with terms and conditions that are in accordance with the standard arrangements approved by the NSW Ministry of Health.
- 2.2 The authorised fee payable to a sessional regional Visiting Medical Officer:
 - (a) who provides a call-back service at a regional hospital listed below; and
 - (b) whose usual place of residence is within a 50 kilometres radius of the regional hospital where the call-back service is provided, is a further 10% loading on the amount that would otherwise have been payable (as provided for at paragraph 1.2) in respect of that occasion of service.

3. Funding

Budget supplementation for the revised fees will be provided by the Ministry based on existing public health organisation budgets for Visiting Medical Officers.
