

Circumcision of Normal Infant Males

Summary Routine circumcision of normal infant males is not performed in public hospitals in NSW Health. This does not apply to cases where there is a clear clinical need for intervention, nor directly to adult male circumcision. This Policy Directive states that parents who request routine circumcision must be provided with accurate information on the risks and benefits of circumcision.

CIRCUMCISION OF NORMAL MALE INFANTS

POLICY STATEMENT

Routine circumcision of normal infant males is **not** performed in public hospitals in NSW Health. This **does not** apply to cases where there is a clear clinical need for intervention, nor directly to adult male circumcision.

Parents who request routine circumcision must be provided with accurate information on the risks and benefits of circumcision.

SUMMARY OF POLICY REQUIREMENTS

Parents who request circumcision for their infant son must be provided with accurate, unbiased and up to date information about the risks and benefits of the procedure.
